Specialized Instructional Services in the Schools Reminder

SLP, OT, PT and SW services are based on need/s that should be discussed at every annual IEP meetings. Three easy things to remember:

- 1) The IEP team makes all decisions
- 2) Specialized Instructional Providers must provide the

EDT/IEP team with current data. Specialized Instructional Providers need to advocate with their data and professional judgment.

3) "Discontinuation criteria" should be discussed at every IEP so parents and team members are familiar with the expectations for discontinuation or dismissal of service. When an Specialized Instructional Provider presents the topic of discontinuation or dismissal of service, it should not come as a surprise to the team or parent and documented data should support the recommendation/s.
